Thank you for your 2007 gift of \$15,000 to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

When the doors to St. Jude opened in 1962, no one could have imagined that a parent might actually be thankful to hear that their child had acute lymphoblastic leukemia (ALL) -- the most common form of childhood cancer. But, that is exactly what happened when St. Jude patient Rebekah was diagnosed with the disease. . .

When little Rebekah was just 2 years old she became ill with a fever and then her mom noticed two lumps on her daughter. The family's pediatrician recommended the little girl be taken to St. Jude for testing, assuring her mother that he did not believe the lumps were cancerous.

Tragically, Rebekah's parents were devastated when St. Jude doctors diagnosed her with ALL and told them that she needed to begin chemotherapy treatments immediately. "The news was so hard to hear," her mom said. "But when the doctor explained that the survival rate for ALL is now 94 percent, and told us how bad some of the other possible diagnoses could have been, as horrible as it sounds, I knew we could be thankful for that."

Seeing how far we have come in the fight against childhood cancer is truly inspiring -- and it is all thanks to the caring and generosity of good people like you. I know with your continued support, we can save more innocent children like Rebekah and win the fight against childhood cancer.
